**Citation for Nida Ansari** 

The Ontario Confederation of University Faculty Associations is pleased to present Nida Ansari with the 2023-2024 Henry Mandelbaum Graduate Fellowship for Excellence in Social Sciences, Humanities, or Arts at the Master's level.

Nida is a Master's student studying Integrative Biology at the University of Guelph which is situated on the ancestral, traditional, unceded, and treaty lands and territories of the Anishinaabeg, Hodinohso:ni, Lūnaapéewak, Huron-Wendat, and Attawandaron peoples.

Nida entered her Master's study after earning an honours Bachelor of Arts from the University of Guelph in 2023.

Nida's academic research focuses on engineering education in Canada and places emphasis on community context as a crucial element in all phases of an engineering project. She will grapple with how engineering education and curriculum highlight and teach community context. In this regard, Nida has also set herself up as a peer support and mentor for students on campus and her volunteer work emphasizes the need for community context within her own community of practice.

Nida's references place her in the top 1-2% of her peers and refer to her as a "clear leader among her peers." They noted: "Nida is genuinely invested in the success of her classmates and helping them recognize meaningful and diverse opportunities available

to them and she sees every opportunity as a meaningful learning experience and strives to ensure that she has an impact on the community around her."
