Aqsa Zahid with the 2022-2023 Henry Mandelbaum Graduate Fellowship for Excellence
in Social Sciences, Humanities, or Arts at the Master's level.

Aqsa is a Master's student at the University of Toronto which is located on the traditional land of the Huron-Wendat, the Seneca, and the Mississaugas of the Credit. Aqsa is studying Clinical Psychology and expects to complete her degree in 2024. She entered her Master's studies after earning an honours Bachelor of Science from the University of Toronto in 2021.

Both Aqsa's exemplary academic pursuits and community involvement demonstrate a deep commitment to the betterment of individual lives through mental health and wellness. As a Master's student, Aqsa's publications and conference presentations are extensive and well beyond many early-stage PhD candidates. She has also achieved excellent grades in her graduate and undergraduate coursework.

Aqsa's commitment to her area of study extends beyond the classroom into the community. In 2022, Aqsa founded a non-profit organization, Seeds 4 Tomorrow, which seeks to plant seeds of mental health knowledge today to grow awareness and plan for a better tomorrow. The organization provides training and awareness building for young people of all ages in an effort to destigmatize these conversations at an early age. Asqa also volunteers at the Ontario Shores Centre for Mental Health Sciences in various

geriatric and forensic units, truly infusing her commitment to mental wellness at all stages of life.

Aqsa's references refer to her as a "rising star in the field of schizophrenia research."
