Promise to continue the 30 per cent off tuition grant for eligible students



Promise to freeze tuition and eliminate interest on student loans, however, the funding allocated to support this promise is inadequate to compensate universities for lost tuition revenue.



Despite a platform commitment that no student would be denied access to PSE due to lack of money, the Feb. 2013 PC white paper promised to eliminate the 30 per cent off tuition grant and establish different tiers of higher education based on students' ability to pay.
